Short-beaked Echidna	<i>Tachyglossus aculeatus</i>	1, 2      Common
Eastern Quoll	<i>Dasyurus viverrinus</i>	1, 2, 3    Common
Swamp Antechinus	<i>Antechinus minimus</i>	1, 2      Uncommon
Dusky Antechinus	<i>Antechinus swainsonii</i>	1, 2      Uncommon
(?) White-footed Dunnart	<i>Sminthopsis leucopus</i>	1, 2      Single sighting 1978, but animal rarely seen
(?) Southern Brown Bandicoot	<i>Isoodon obesulus</i>	1, 2      Single sighting 1977
(?) Eastern Barred Bandicoot	<i>Perameles gunnii</i>	2      Two records – one remains in cat stomach, and the other 1967
Ringtail Possum	<i>Pseudocheirus peregrinus</i>	2, 3     Uncommon
Brushtail Possum	<i>Trichosurus vulpecula</i>	1, 2, 3    Common
Little Pygmy Possum	<i>Cercatetus lepidus</i>	1, 2, 4, 5   Rarely seen
Eastern Pygmy Possum	<i>Cercatetus nanus</i>	2, 5     Rarely seen
Long-nosed Potoroo	<i>Potorous tridactylus</i>	1, 2, 3    Common
(?) Tasmanian Bettong	<i>Bettongia gaimardi</i>	1, 2      Multiple sightings, but rarely seen
Tasmanian Pademelon	<i>Thylogale billardierii</i>	1, 2, 3    Common
Bennetts Wallaby	<i>Macropus rufogriseus</i>	2, 3      Common
Water Rat	<i>Hydromys chrysogaster</i>	2, 3      Common
Long-tailed Mouse	<i>Pseudomys higginsi</i>	1, 2      Multiple capture, but rarely seen
Swamp Rat	<i>Rattus lutreolus</i>	2      Common
Goulds Wattled Bat	<i>Chalinolobus gouldii</i>	2, 6     Rarely identified
Chocolate Wattled Bat	<i>Chalinolobus morio</i>	2      Rarely identified
Large Forest Bat	<i>Vespadelus darlingtoni</i>	2      Rarely identified
Southern Forest Bat	<i>Vespadelus regulus</i>	2      Rarely identified
(?) Little Forest Bat	<i>Vespadelus vulturnus</i>	2      Single sighting
(?) Tasmanian Falsistrellus	<i>Falsistrellus tasmaniensis</i>	2      Single sighting
Lesser Long-eared Bat	<i>Nyctophilus geoffroyi</i>	2, 3     Common, rarely identified
Tasmanian Long-eared Bat	<i>Nyctophilus sherrini</i>	2      Rarely identified
