



Alternatively - walk from 2 tree Point carpark - 30 mins return





Self guided walk 3 - Grass point coast walk

At south end of Adventure Bay: Car park behind beach. Walk along beach and cross small creek follow the signs to the track. This walk traverses National Park and you should have a Parks Pass

An easy to medium walk. Generally level but surface is uneven in places. One and a half hours return First part is along beach and then follow a coastal track to Grass Point. Spend time sitting on the rocks at Grass point and viewing the scenery. Return by the same route Walk passes through historic whaling areas and areas of significance to Aboriginal people





Self guided walk 4 - Luggabone Circuit Walk

Access at Jetty Beach, Turn off Lighthouse Road Access Road 1.5km before Light House. This is a rough uneven track (2km), unsuitable for 2 wheel drive vehicles). Park in camping, picnic area. Track entrance at SW corner. The walk traverses National Park and you should have a Parks Pass

An easy to medium walk. Generally level but surface is uneven in places. Some hilly sections Two hour circuit walk. Walk passes through open coastal heath country on the western portion, low lying heathland and woodland on northern side. If weather is warm be aware of snakes.
